We've added a presentation on **Cognitive Functioning in Older Age** by **Tom Fritsch, PhD**, of the UWM Center on Age and Community. Fritsch will discuss the latest research in memory, reducing the risk of memory loss, maintaining brain function, the role of computers as a training tool, and new ways to look at dementia.
